

## **Parkfield U13A crowned Harrow Youth Football Premier League Champions**

Parkfield overcame a spirited Headstone Manor to win 3-0 and captured the Harrow Youth Football premier league title.

Two goals from Louie Covello on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 40<sup>th</sup> minute and one from substitute Louis Bircham on 33 minutes was enough for the champions to top the table on 45 points and finish 3 points clear of their main rivals Spartans.

For the first 25 minutes of the game, both teams evenly shared the spoils of possession, attack and unfortunate misses; Parkfield had 5 great chances off target; Headstone Manor had 4.

It wasn't until the 26<sup>th</sup> minute that Parkfield broke the deadlock. Initiated by Charlie Hobday, Devaughn Williams executed a great pass to Covello who in turn scored to make it 1-0.

Covello was on target again. Jamie Abbott controlled the ball out of the sky from a great kick out from goalkeeper Daniel Wilkes and passed to Covello (who was the man of the match) then lobbed the keeper to make it 2-0 in the 40<sup>th</sup> minute.

The final goal of the game was by some lovely work between substitutes Bircham, Karim Aboussada and midfielder Sam O'Neill. O'Neill played Bircham in who made no mistake and finished off the game with a great shot to make 3-0.

The league win is the teams first since playing 11-a-side football. They finished second the previous two years, they achieved the feat by winning all but one game and scoring some 92 goals whilst only conceding 12 times.

The team from Hatch End could create Parkfield history this weekend on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> May they meet St Josephs in the Harrow Observer League cup final and a win would make this the first ever treble winning side at the club. Sunday's game is at North Greenford united FC, Berkeley drive Greenford Middlesex with a 12pm kick off.
